Since 2009, Filippo Bonacci has served as the primary Line Producer for the Zurich University of the Arts Film Department (ZHdK), overseeing annual production of the fiction and documentary production. In addition, he also teaches film production at the Bachelor and Master level and is currently the chair of the Creative Producing Master program. As a Production Manager and Line Producer, Filippo Bonacci has worked on many national and international feature films. He has also served many years in the expert committee of the Swiss Federal Office of Culture. Actually, Filippo Bonacci is member of the Swiss Syndicate of Film Technicians as well as a member of the IDM Film Fund & Commission of Südtirol & Alto Adige in Italy.

Alberto Pasquale

Alberto Pasquale is an Independent Expert, Senior Consultant in Strategy, Management, Finance and Marketing, specialized in Film & TV business. Among his clients: Italian Ministry of Culture - Cinema Directorate, Rai Television, Sky Cinema, Officine Ubu (Independent film distributor) and 100autori, the most important Italian association of Film & TV Scriptwriters and Directors. He has been General Manager (2003-2007) at 20th Century Fox Italy. Before that, he has been Sales Assistant Manager (1990-1992) and Marketing Director (1995-2003) at Warner Bros. Italy. Previously (1992-1995) he worked for RCS Films & TV (Rizzoli – Corriere della Sera Publishing Group) as Head of Theatrical Distribution. He has been Member of the board of Majestic Films & TV, a sales company based in London. From 2008 to 2011, he has been Head of Audio-Visual Department at Filas S.p.A. (Finanziaria Laziale di Sviluppo), as Filas managed until 2011 a Regional Audiovisual Fund. His consultancy role with Lazio Region continues through Lazio Innova, the in-house regional company in charge of management of international co-production film & TV series funds. Mr. Pasquale has been Member of the board of Cine-Regio, the European Network associating the most important European regional funds dedicated to the audiovisual sector.

He has an extensive lecturing experience. At present, he is Teaching Fellow in Movie Industry at Università Bocconi (Milan), and has been teacher in Film & TV Business at Università Sapienza in Rome (2011-2016), where is Director of Studies of MASPA, Master in Scriptwriting and Audiovisual Production. Also in Rome, Mr. Pasquale teaches at LUISS Business School and Centro Sperimentale di Cinematografia. He has been lecturer in Film Marketing & Distribution at Media Business School (Madrid - Ronda), and teaches Marketing, Buyer Behaviour, International Marketing and International Management at the European School of Economics, Rome campus.

Mr. Pasquale is one of the authors of The Audiovisual Management Handbook (2002), published by Media Business School and has published two books on Cinema Tax Credit in Italy (2008 and 2012). He holds a Master degree in Economics from Università Bocconi, a Postgraduate degree in Film Direction and Scriptwriting from the Film School of Milan and a Postgraduate degree in Audiovisual Production (EAVE).
